Deene Park is the family home of the Brudenell family and the house has been in the family for over 500 years. One of the family's famous ancestors is the 7th Earl of Cardigan who led the Charge of the Light Brigade. The house contains a collection of memorabilia from the Crimea and a fine collection of the 7th Earl's uniforms. The house also has formal gardens and a lovely old kitchen tea room which serves home made lunches & cakes!

Some handy tips to keep you warm and healthy this coming winter!

- If you're not very mobile, are 65 or over, or have a health condition, heat your home to at least 18C (65F)
- Keep your bedroom at 18C all night if you can and keep the bedroom window closed.
- Draw the curtains at dusk and keep doors closed to block out draughts
- Wear several layers of clothes rather than one chunky layer clothes made from cotton, wool or fleecy fibres help to maintain body heat
- Use a hot water bottle or electric blanket to keep warm in bed but don't use both at the same time
- Have at least one hot meal a day eating regularly helps keep you warm; and make sure you have hot drinks regularly
- Try not to sit still for more than an hour or so indoors get up and stretch your legs
- Stay active even moderate exercise can help keep you warm
- Find out if you can get the flu jab for free on the NHS
- If you start to feel unwell, even if it's a cough or cold, don't wait until it gets more serious. Seek advice from your <u>pharmacist</u>.

Why not check up on older vulnerable neighbours and relatives to make sure:

- They are safe and well?
- They are warm enough, especially at night?
- They have stocks of food and medicines so they don't need to go out during very cold weather?

Looking for things to do and places to go? Have you checked out your village phone box for information to help you?! What a great idea! Well done to Weedon Bec!

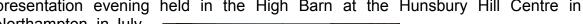


Not just a defibrillator in this phone box but a library as well! Have you spotted this one? This phone box can be seen in Fotheringhay.
