	The site plan does not contain School Lodge as an adjoining property and in fact marks it as a Play Area
	 No Specification or quantity of the number of heat pumps to be sited Says there are no trees but clearly there are so a tree survey should be undertaken
	 The Map used is inaccurate even though we know that the owner of School Lodge provided full site plans to the school in Feb 2022 No boundaries nor overhead wires are shown on plan but both exist
	Promised photograph of heat pumps is not included in the application
	 No noise report - levels indicated for school are just below maximum level yet School Lodge is closer to the proposed site. We feel a full noise report/evaluation should be undertaken
	The owner of School Lodge indicates that there are bats in the tree adjacent to the site so this should be investigated and a bat report should be included in the application if required West North application and the long of the sections.
	West Northamptonshire are the land owners and therefore a

potential conflict of interest should be declared and noted

 School Lodge has retained land status around her site and this current for next 60 odd years to run and therefore legal papers should be checked against this application

It is the belief of the Parish Council that this application is so incomplete that it should be returned to the applicant with immediate effect and a new application is started once complete information has been received, if this application is allowed to be amended then the full 21 days consultation for all parties should be started again.

The Parish Council understands that works have already commenced and that WNC should consider a stop being placed on works as some of the points raised could be subject to legal review (retained land rights), the Parish Council is also worried that by rushing through with work before a complete and competent application has been approved they are potentially putting the welfare of young people and staff at risk by now potentially having no heating as we will soon be approaching the autumn/winter season. However, the Parish Council do not feel this is a reason that the application should be fast tracked or bulldozed through a process.

Notes of Parish Councillors' Surgery

28th July 2022

Present: Pete Morgan

Issues raised: Resident A:

The issues related to a planning application that was considered at the Council meeting on the 1st August 2022, when the issues discussed were explored with the full Council so will not be repeated here.

Resident B:

The issues primarily related to Hill Row, an unmade road off the A45. The resident said she had been in contact with 2 Councillors previously, John Pomfret and Graham Newman, but was still waiting for responses from them. The condition of Hill Row continues to deteriorate, exacerbated by run-off from the field above it and by refuse lorries driving up it. In addition, Anglian Water have recently dug across the road and not returned it to its previous state. The resident is concerned at what will happen if Gigaclear also dig up across Hill Row. Visibility to exit Hill Row is poor due to the length of the grass and the overgrown verge; the resident's husband has been cutting himself but is in his 70s. In the meantime, the speed and weight of traffic on the A45 makes entering and leaving Hill Row dangerous.

On a separate issue, the resident asked if anything could be done about a tree in the graveyard that is hanging over Church Road and is likely to fall

I agreed to raise the above at the coming Parish Council meeting and get back to Resident B

Resident C:

Asked if the speed sign could be sited at the bottom if Spinney Hill to deter motorists speeding as they enter the village from Bragborough Hill. I agreed to ask whether this was a site to be used by the speed sign.
